

# The Hat



A simple and modern beanie as a winter wardrobe staple. Knitted in LANGYARNS CASHMERE DREAMS.



Sizes	1	2	3
Head circumference	48/53	53/58	57/61

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## MATERIALS:

- Circular needles N°3.25 with a short cable (at the end of the hat you can finish with the "magic loops" technique or with a pair of sock needles)
- 9 marker rings.
- A wool needle
- A row counter

## YARN:

1 skein of LANGYARNS CASHMERE DREAMS; knit double

## GAUGE:

Swatch in stockinette stitch with yarn held double: 10 cm/10 cm with needle 3.25 (washed and blocked)

23 stitches



If your swatch is smaller, use a larger needle and make a new one.

If your swatch is larger, use a smaller needle and make a new one.

## ABBREVIATIONS:

K = knit	Sts = stitches
K2tog = knit 2 stitches together knit wise	
PM = place marker	
SSK = slip, slip, knit slipped stitches together through the back loop	

## STITCHES USED:

Stockinette stitch in the round: all stitches are knit

## DIRECTIONS:

Cast-on and beginning of the hat:

To knit your hat with yarn held double, take the two ends of the yarn out of your skein and cast-on 92 / 100 / 108 stitches with the long tail cast-on (allow a good meter of yarn before your starting slipknot).

Close stitches to work in the round and place a marker for the beginning of the round.

Caution: Be careful not to twist your work during the first few rounds of knitting.

Knit stockinette stitch in the round for 18 / 22 / 23 cm.

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Last row before decreases:

K 11 / 12 / 13, \*PM, K 1, PM, K 22 / 24 / 26\* repeat from \* to \* two more times, PM, K 1, PM, K 11 / 12 / 13

Decrease Rounds:

Alternate these two rows until you have 12 stitches left on your needle:

Round A: \* knit to 2 sts before marker, SSK, K 1, K2tog\* repeat from \* to \* three more times, knit to End

Round B: knit all

Closing the hat:

When you have 12 stitches left, remove all the markings, cut the thread so that you have about 50 cm left, pull the end of the thread through all the stitches, and pull it tight to close the hole. Sew the ends in.

Wash your work by hand in water at room temperature with a suitable detergent and allow the hat to dry flat. The rolled edge should be about 1cm.
